

DOG SAFTY ALERT



Notice to all dog owners in Central Oregon

Please be on the lookout for these mushrooms in your yards, at dog parks and out on our local hiking trails. These mushrooms in the Amanita family, are highly toxic to dogs (and humans) and can be fatal unless aggressive medical treatment is administered. To help speed diagnosis and treatment, if at all possible, take a sample of the suspect mushroom with you to the vet including anything your pet may have vomited. A plastic container will do for the vomit.

If your pet exhibits two or more of the following symptoms and you suspect he/she may have eaten a wild mushroom seek immediate medical attention. Time is very important in achieving a successful outcome.

Vomiting

Weakness

Uncoordinated Movements

Diarrhea

Lethargy

Excessive drooling

Abdominal pain

Yellowing of the skin

Seizures or coma
